Guided by three main principles of naming, shaming and jailing, Anas uses unconventional methods to expose wrongdoing at all levels of Ghanaian society. Despite being widely known for his brand of brazen journalism, Anas maintains a degree of anonymity by keeping his face hidden from public view. The OWFF is thrilled to premiere in Ottawa this entertaining and thought-provoking documentary by award-winning filmmaker Ryan Mullins at this special, one-night-only screening.
